Background



February 2006

- The State Water Board adopted the first statewide Sanitary Sewer Systems General Order 2006-0003-DWQ:
 - For consistent statewide regulation of sanitary sewer spills
 - Regulated publicly owned sanitary sewer systems of greater than one mile in length


September 2013

• State Water Board Executive Director amended the Monitoring and Reporting requirements (Order 2013-0058-EXEC)






General Order Reissuance Process

This is Not a New Order

Reissued Order updates the 16-year-old statewide Waste Discharge Requirements to:


- Clarify existing Water Code regulations and compliance expectations to:
 - Address spills to waters of the State
 - Address climate change impacts on a system-specific level
- Reduce Cost of Compliance through reduced spill reporting and extended planning periods
- Clarify Order enforceability:
 - Full electronic reporting into CIWQS
 - Penalty of Perjury clause for failure to report, or intentionally reporting false data



Waste Discharge Requirements Protects Waters of the State

- Reissued Order 2022-0103-DWQ emphasizes the protection of waters of the State
- Waters of the State include surface waters and groundwater
- Order addresses pathways that spilled sewage enters both surface waters and groundwater







Overview of Order 2022-0103-DWQ

Major Changes from Order 2006-0003-DWQ

- Structure of Order and added findings to provide factual basis for reissued Order
- Expanded regulatory coverage for privately-owned, federally-owned, and non-governmental sewer systems
 - Upon Regional Water Boards discretion
- Expanded implementation of State Water Board authority per the Water Code to prohibit sewage discharges to waters of the State (versus only waters of the U.S.)
- New prohibition of potential sewage discharge to a surface water unless properly cleaned up and reported
- Strengthened qualifications for Legally Responsible Officials




Major Changes from Order 2006-0003-DWQ (cont.)

- Requirements to address system-specific climate change impacts
- Electronic reporting of all required plans and reports
- Submittal of electronic service area boundary map
- Submittal of CIWQS-generated system performance graphs (in annual report)
- Reduced timeframe for receiving water sampling of 50,000+ gallons spills to surface water
- Requirements to address tree roots due to water conservation or other factors
- Reduced reporting for smaller spills

General Order Organization

What the General Order regulates:

- Sanitary Sewer Systems, including:
 - Laterals owned and/or operated by the Enrollee;
 - Satellite sewer systems; and
 - Temporary conveyance and storage facilities.

Who the General Order regulates:

- Public agencies that own/operate sanitary sewer system(s) greater than one mile in length;
- Public agencies that own/operate systems one mile or less, upon Water Board discretion;
- Federal facilities, private companies, or non-governmental entities of any size system, upon Water Board discretion.

Attachment E1. Notification, Monitoring, Reporting and Recordkeeping Requirements

ATTACHMENT E1 – NOTIFICATION, MONITORING, REPORTING AND RECORDKEEPING REQUIREMENTS

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Spill Categories

Category 1

Any volume of sewage that discharges to:

- A surface water, including a surface water body that contains no flow or volume of water, or
- A drainage conveyance system that discharges to a surface water, when the sewage is not fully captured and returned to the sewer system or disposed of properly.

Category 2

A spill of 1,000 gallons or greater that does not discharge to a surface water.

Spill Categories

Category 3

A spill equal to or greater than 50 gallons, and less than 1000 gallons, that does not discharge to a surface water.

Category 4

A spill of less than 50 gallons that does not discharge to a surface water.

Category 3

A spill of less than 1000 gallons, that does not discharge to a surface water.

Requirement	Spill Category 1: Spills to Surface Waters		
Notification	 Within two hours of the Enrollee's knowledge of a Category 1 spill of <u>1,000 gallons or greater</u>, discharging or threatening to discharge to surface waters: Notify the California Office of Emergency Services. 		
Monitoring	 Conduct visual monitoring; For spills of 50,000 gallons or greater to surface waters: Conduct receiving water sampling within 18 hours of initial knowledge of spill 		
Reporting	 Submit Draft Spill Report within three business days of the knowledge of the spill; Submit Certified Spill Report within 15 calendar days of the spill end date; Submit Technical Report within 45 calendar days after the spill end date - <u>for a Category 1 spill of 50,000 gallons or greater;</u> Submit Amended Spill Report within 90 calendar days after the spill end date. 		

Requirement	Spill Category 2: Spills of 1,000 Gallons or Greater That Do Not Discharge to Surface Waters		
Notification	 Within two hours of the knowledge of a Category 2 spill of 1,000 gallons or greater, discharging or threatening to discharge to waters of the State: Notify California Office of Emergency Services. 		
Monitoring	 Conduct visual monitoring. 		
 Reporting Submit Draft Spill Report within three business days of the knowledge of the spill; Submit Certified Spill Report within 15 calendar days of the spill end date; Submit Amended Spill Report within 90 calendar days after the spill end date. 			

Requirement	Spill Category 3: Spills of Equal to or Greater than 50 Gallons and Less Th 1,000 Gallons That Do Not Discharge to Surface Waters		
Notification	Not Applicable		
Monitoring	Conduct visual monitoring.		
Reporting	 Submit monthly Certified Spill Report to the online CIWQS Sanitary Sewer System Database within 30 Calendar days after the end of the month in which the spills occurred; Submit Amended Spill Report within 90 calendar days after the Certified Spill Report due date. 		

Requirement	Spill Category 4: Spills Less Than 50 Gallons That Do Not Discharge to Surface Waters		
Notification	Not Applicable		
Monitoring	 Conduct visual monitoring. 		
Reporting	 Certify monthly, the estimated total spill volume and the total number of all Category 4 spills into CIWQS, within 30 days after the end of the calendar month in which the spills occurred. Upload and certify a report of all Category 4 spills to CIWQS, by February 1st after the end of the calendar year in which the spills occurred. 		

Requirement	Enrollee Owned and/or Operated Lateral Spills That Do Not Discharge to Surface Waters		
Notification	 Within two hours of the Enrollee's knowledge of a spill of 1,000 gallons or greater, from an enrollee-owned and/or operated lateral, discharging or threatening to discharge to waters of the State: Notify California Office of Emergency Services. Not applicable to a spill of less than 1,000 gallons. 		
Monitoring	Conduct visual monitoring.		
Reporting	 Upload and certify a report of all lateral spills (that do not discharge to a surface water) to CIWQS, by February 1st after the end of the calendar year in which the spills occurred. Report a lateral spill of any volume discharged to a surface water as a Category 1 spill.

Spill Emergency Response Plan

Update and implement by June 5, 2023

- The annually updated Spill Emergency Response Plan must address:
 - Prompt detection and response to spills.
 - Collection of spill information for prevention of future spills.
 - Notification of primary responders, regulatory agencies and affected entities.
 - Notification, Monitoring and Reporting requirements of the Order.
 - Coordination with storm drain agencies and other utility agencies.
 - Spill containment, clean up and prevention of discharges to waters of the State
 - Post-spill assessment of spill response activities.

Legally Responsible Official Designation

Designate Legally Responsible Official by: June 5, 2023

The Legally Responsible Official must:

- Have responsibility over management of the Enrollee's entire sanitary sewer system.
- Be authorized to make managerial decisions that govern the operation of the system.
- Have direct authority over individuals that:
 - Possess a degree or certificate related to operations and maintenance of sanitary sewer systems, and/or
 - Have professional training and experience related to the management of sanitary sewer systems.


