



### **Challenges of Recycled Water Reuse from a Regulatory POV: When Beneficial Uses Collide**

**Eric Lindberg, PG CHG** Executive Officer of the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board, will discuss the challenges of reusing treated wastewater for groundwater replenishment and potable reuse projects. A certified hydrogeologist with 20 years of experience, Eric specializes in groundwater management, salt and nutrient programs, and water quality regulation.


