Challenges of Recycled Water Reuse from a Regulatory POV: When Beneficial Uses Collide

Eric Lindberg, PG CHG Executive Officer of the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board, will discuss the challenges of reusing treated wastewater for groundwater replenishment and potable reuse projects. A certified hydrogeologist with 20 years of experience, Eric specializes in groundwater management, salt and nutrient programs, and water quality regulation.

Karen Williams, General Manager of the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority (SAWPA), will discuss how the Inland Empire Brine Line protects regional water quality, enables water reuse, and strengthens statewide water reliability. With over 36 years of experience, Karen leads SAWPA's collaborative efforts to deliver sustainable, multi-benefit water solutions across the Santa Ana River Watershed.



Riverside County Flood Overview

Jason Uhley, General Manager of the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, brings 30 years of experience in flood risk, stormwater quality, and water conservation. A registered civil engineer, he leads statewide and national efforts advancing stormwater management as President of the National Association of Flood and Stormwater Management Agencies.

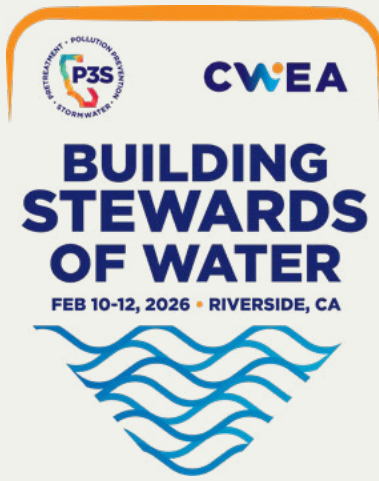

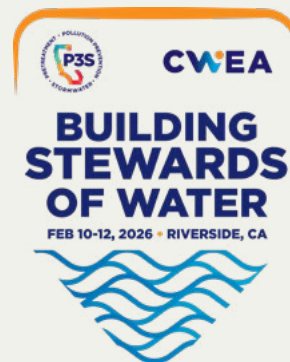
