Cal-OSHA's Workplace Violence and Indoor Heat Illness: Compliance, Enforcement, and Predictions

Inland Empire Utilities Agency's Mutual Aid Program Efforts for Regional Sanitary Sewer Spill Simulations

The Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA), a regional wastewater treatment and water agency encompassing 242 square miles in western San Bernadino County and servicing approximately 935,000 people, provides sewage utility services to seven sewer collection agencies and wholesale imported water from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California to regional retail agencies. In 2004, IEUA entered into a Mutual Aid Agreement with their Regional Contracting Agencies and other partners to provide emergency response in the event of a disruption which would affect the water service, sewer service or sewage treatment services provided by each agency. Over the years, IEUA has taken the lead in organizing quarterly meetings between the Mutual Aid partners for sewer collection training, discussions on regional system issues, and regulatory updates.

Due to the current increase in retirements and the need for hands on training for line staff, IEUA took the lead to develop a regional approach for multi-agency sanitary sewer spill simulation training. **PRESENTERS: Lucia Diaz and Edward Makowski**, Inland Empire Utilities Agency

Utility Line Locating for Wastewater

Locating Wastewater is more difficult and more confusing than most Subsurface Utilities. The goal of this class is to clarify the Codes and Best Practices & Standards of Locating Wastewater Lines, as well as introducing techniques that can help Identify, deep and difficult Wastewater Lines. There will be a brief discussion on Theory, Code and the Best Practices & Standards followed by a Hands-On presentation.

Trenching and Excavating in Wastewater

Cal OSHA trenching and excavation standards (CCR1541) require employers to identify and control hazards where workers are exposed. According to Cal OSHA, over a 5-year period, 26 California workers died, and 207 others were injured in trench cave-ins. In almost every instance, improperly implemented protective measures were the cause of the accident. In this session participants will learn about common hazards encountered when working in or near trenching and excavations, best practice methods to correct these hazards, the importance of competent person designations and daily inspections, and how wastewater can introduce another layer of hazards to control.

Traffic Control for Mobile Operations

A Journey Through the Cal/OSHA Citation Process

In March of 2022, Western Municipal Water District experienced an injury which turned out to be a Cal/OSHA reportable. During this time many COVID-19 restrictions were still in place at workplaces, hospitals, medical clinics, and other facilities. This presentation discusses what happened during the incident, treatment completed onsite, CPR/first aid training, employee concerns/refusals, the aftermath of treatment, failures of emergency rooms for documentation, the inspection process and the ways in which COVID-19 changed it. Other topics include the dreaded spam folder, the rebuttal process, investigation documents – who to share with and where to keep them, defense against citation and explanation, informal conference, closure, and current policies and procedures that helped navigate the incident, as well as changes that Western Municipal Water District made to become better prepared.

Manhole Virtual Models

One of the biggest hazards in maintaining wastewater systems is confined space entry. Not only are there hazards related to the limited space but also with the exposure to hydrogen sulfide and other toxic gases. Eliminating the need for confined space entry significantly improves the safety of operators in the field. RH Borden and Company has now developed a way to create an exact digital twin of underground structures such as manholes and wet wells and enabled operators to enter these manholes virtually through virtual reality headsets. This new technology is called Manhole Virtual Modeling (MVM) and can be used to assess attributes such as manhole degradation, dimensions, pipe sizes, infiltration, and many other attributes typically assessed in person by an operator. With this, manholes, wet wells, lift stations, and other confined spaces should never be entered for the purpose of assessments and should only be entered if construction or rehabilitation is required.

This class will explain how Manhole Virtual Models (MVM's) are created and used and provide case studies highlighting the benefits of this new technology.

Lockout/Tagout Lockout/Blockout: Why is this on?

This session educates employees about the importance of using LOTO/LOBO protection in the workplace to ensure worker safety. This course will raise the awareness of employees to the importance of following protocol of CalOSHA standards in regards to lockout tagout. The purpose of this course is to prevent injuries caused by unexpected start-up or the release of stored energy by machine and equipment during setup, maintenance and servicing. This is a general overview session with Q&A.
