By 2011, his efforts had not only stabilized WECO but also made it profitable, a remarkable achievement considering the earlier struggles.

Tom's expertise extended beyond just management; he was one of the last mentors for the rodding equipment, possessing the knowledge to repair even older models like the SRECO rodder. His adaptability and willingness to embrace industry changes and improvements ensured WECO stayed relevant in a rapidly evolving market.

The passing of Gordon White in 2021 marked another transition for WECO, with Tom assuming full ownership of the company. Despite the challenges, Tom continued to lead with integrity and values, qualities he instilled in his sons, Thomas and Noah, from a young age. Mentoring them since they were 15, Tom prepared his sons to take over the reins when the time came.

However, on February 10, 2024, Tom's sudden passing left a void in WECO Industries. Nevertheless, Thomas and Noah, now entrusted with the legacy of their father and the company, are determined to uphold the same principles of integrity and excellence that guided Tom and Gordon. With their upbringing and Tom's teachings, they are well-equipped to lead WECO into the future.
