Online Training Day Summary July 29, 2020

Debbie Webster, Executive Officer for CVCWA (Central Valley Clean Water Association), gave a very informative presentation of how to prepare and plan for the upcoming TNI/ELAP laboratory certification changes. Highlighting the major differences of what the Nelac Institute's TNI standard is and what was implemented by the State of California, she laid out the "roadmap to accreditation" as well as the types of accreditation and the fees that are associated with Fields of Testing (FOTs). It is a complicated process that will most likely impact every environmental lab in the state to implement new procedures to comply with increasingly strict laboratory standards.





Online Training Day Summary July 29, 2020, continued

Tom Bruton, PhD gave a great presentation about the history and effects of PFAS/PFOA. highlighted the prevalence and exposure to people and the environment, including testing results and health concerns. Carpet, fast food containers, Teflon, and many consumer products contain PFAS and are a significant source of human exposure. Many industries have recognized the problems with PFAS and are going away from the use of these compounds. Activated carbon and reverse osmosis can be effective treatment steps to remove PFAS from water, but are extremely expensive to build and operate at a municipal scale. The most recent order imposed by the state of California requires PFAS sampling at POTWs, requiring 4 quarters of testing beginning in the 4th quarter (October) 2020. What flows into the POTW comes out in effluent and biosolids, as the biological process does NOT remove PFAS. Longer chain PFAS seem to settle out better in biosolids, whereas the newer "replacement" chemicals are more subject to pass through in the effluent. Wastewater agencies will need to examine the presence of PFAS to determine if treatment plant processes will need to be adjusted and if biosolids land application is a viable disposal option for the foreseeable future. 




