## Training Day Report, Oroville, Ca, July 17, 2018 By Tracy Wyhlidko

We would like to thank the Sewerage Commission – Oroville Region for hosting the CWEA NSVS training day on July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018. The attendance was great with 33 members present. The tool discussion and tour of the Bolt Tool Museum at the end of the day was one of a kind.

The morning began a slight change of schedule. The first speaker from CWEA came down with the stomach flu the day before our class and had

to cancel. Luckily, one of our scheduled speakers brought a co-worker who had a second training talk with him. With the slight change, we began the morning with Brianna Barton from Carollo Engineers presenting, "Save Energy through Aeration Blower Replacement." Ms. Barton discussed the recent blower replacement project that Carollo Engineers performed at Fairfield-Suisun Sewer District 23.7 MGD plant. The old blowers were 30% of the energy usage at the plant. The new project will

increase efficiency, reduce energy use, and is partially funded by grants and rebates that were made available by the Green Project Reserve of the State Revolving Fund.

Second, Mr. J.J. Jeffries from Rockwell Solutions and Jon Neuenschwander from Vogelsang presented, "Positive Displacement Pumps and their Application". Positive displacement pumps are more expensive that centrifugal pumps, but are better for sludge, truck loading and unloading, suction lift, viscous contents, and are easily reversible. Pump suppliers need information from wastewater operators such as pH, pressure, flow ranges, future increases, space limitations, etc. before they can properly advise you on the type of pump needed for different parts of your plant.





#### Training Day Report, Oroville, Ca, July 17, 2018 (continued)



The third presentation was by Mr. Jon Neuenschwander from Vogelsang titled, "Grinders and Macerators". This presentation compared the operation, construction, and maintenance between traditional twin shaft grinders and roto-cut macerators. "Grinders cut like a chain saw and macerators cut like scissors." The blade designs from Vogelsang are unique because they are a monolithic blade machined out of a solid block of steel, rather than a blade-spacer-blade-spacer design. The presentation helped educate us on which situations are better for either a grinder or a macerator.

The last presentation was by Alex Fastro and Alex Daijogo, both from the City of Galt, titled "Upgrade at the Galt WWTP for Nitrogen Removal." The City of Galt operates a 1.7 MGD Oxidation Ditch type plant for a population of 25,000. Simple changes made to add VFD's, a new surface aerator to the plant, and adding real time ammonia and nitrate probes have allowed plant operators to optimize the nitrogen removal. Settling in the plant




increased by adding more dissolved oxygen. Monitoring the dissolved oxygen more frequently and using ORP probes has also helped track trends in the aeration process control. Fixed deflectors were installed ahead of the new probes to keep the rags from collecting on the probes. The upgrades have resulted in 100% compliance at the plant for the past 2 years.



#### Training Day Report, Oroville, Ca, July 17, 2018 (continued)

The tour at Bolt's Antique Tool Museum began with a brief presentation by "Bud" Bolt. Mr. Bolt (yes, that's his real name) began working in the tool business as a Snap-On tool salesman. He started collecting old tools as a way to keep student's attention in the high school shop classes that he visited. A small collection of about a dozen tools began a lifelong passion which became the museum. Mr. Bolt believes that the single most important development in human history is our ability to create and use tools. He even passed around one of the original "Ford Fixers", which was the tool that fit every bolt on the Model T Ford. Next time you are in Oroville, it's worth your time to visit the museum at 1650 Broderick Street.


